



Synopsis

Setting: Seville, Spain around 1820.

Act 1: Soldiers stand guard outside a cigarette factory. Micaëla asks about Don José and leaves when she learns he'll arrive soon. José's platoon arrives, and he learns Micaëla loves him. Factory workers take a break, and Carmen, a provocative Romani, sings the famous aria "Habanera," throwing a flower at José. Micaëla returns with a letter from José's mother urging him to marry her. A fight in the factory leads to Carmen's arrest, but she convinces José to let her escape, resulting in his imprisonment.

Act 2: A month later in a tavern, Carmen and friends are entertained by the bullfighter Escamillo. He offers love to Carmen, but she is set on José, recently released from prison. Smugglers plot their next move, asking Carmen to recruit José. José arrives and professes his love, showing her the flower she threw at him. Carmen demands he prove his love by deserting the army. They are interrupted by José's commander, Zuniga, leading to a fight that forces José to join the smugglers.

Act 3: In the mountains, José is with the smugglers but longs for home. Carmen mocks him and suggests he leave. Fortune cards predict Carmen's death. Micaëla arrives to save José, while Escamillo comes seeking Carmen. José and Escamillo fight but are stopped by the smugglers. Micaëla tells José his mother is dying, and he leaves, warning Carmen they'll meet again.

Act 4: The next month, in front of the bullfight arena, Escamillo, now Carmen's lover, is cheered by spectators. He enters the arena, but Carmen stays behind. José appears, begging Carmen to start anew with him. She refuses and throws away his ring. As cheers erupt from the arena for Escamillo, José, in a fit of rage, stabs Carmen to death.

Sinopsis en Español

Ambientación: Sevilla, España, alrededor de 1820

Acto 1: Los soldados montan guardia fuera de una fábrica de cigarrillos. Micaëla pregunta por Don José y se va cuando se entera de que llegará pronto. Llega el pelotón de José, y él se entera de que Micaëla lo ama. Las trabajadoras de la fábrica toman un descanso, y Carmen, una provocativa Romani, canta la famosa aria "Habanera," lanzando una flor a José. Micaëla regresa con una carta de la madre de José instándole a casarse con ella. Una pelea en la fábrica lleva al arresto de Carmen, pero ella convence a José de dejarla escapar, resultando en su encarcelamiento.

Acto 2: Un mes después en una taberna, Carmen y sus amigas son entretenidas por el torero Escamillo. Él le ofrece amor a Carmen, pero ella está interesada en José, que ha sido liberado de prisión recientemente. Los contrabandistas planean su próximo movimiento y le piden a Carmen que reclute a José. José llega y le declara su amor, mostrándole laflor que ella le lanzó. Carmen le exige que demuestre su amor desertando del ejército. Son interrumpidos por el comandante de José, Zuniga, lo que lleva a una pelea que obliga a José a unirse a los contrabandistas.

Acto 3: En las montañas, José está con los contrabandistas, pero anhela su hogar. Carmen se burla de él y sugiere que se vaya. Las cartas del tarot predicen la muerte de Carmen. Micaëla llega para salvar a José, mientras que Escamillo viene en busca de Carmen. José y Escamillo luchan, pero son detenidos por los contrabandistas. Micaëla le dice a José que su madre está muriendo, y él se va, advirtiendo a Carmen que se volverán a encontrar.

Acto 4: Al mes siguiente, frente a la arena de toros, Escamillo, ahora amante de Carmen, es aclamado por los espectadores. Él entra a la arena, pero Carmen se queda atrás. José aparece, rogándole a Carmen que comience de nuevo con él. Ella se niega y tira su anillo. Mientras los vítores del público resuenan en la arena para Escamillo, José, en un ataque de rabia, apuñala a Carmen hasta matarla.

Cast biographies:

Carmen: Aubrey Adams McMillan



Aubrey, a versatile singer, collaborates with composers and performs across various genres. She has sung with the prestigious Utah Symphony, Intermezzo, Utah Opera, NOVA Chamber Music, Southwest Symphony, and Cathedral of the Madeleine concert series. Aubrey received the Marian Anderson scholarship at Westminster Choir College and was a two-time district finalist in the Metropolitan Opera competition. As a new Doctorate student at the University of Utah, she researches phonation and vagal tone. Aubrey also teaches at Westminster College and served as President of the Northern Utah chapter of the National Association of Teachers of Singing.

Carmen: Sandra Aldas



Sandra Aldaz, a Mexican soprano, began her formal singing studies at the Universidad Autonoma de Chihuahua at age 18, earning a Bachelor's degree in Music Education. She made her international debut as a soloist at the Hawaii International Music Festival in August 2017 and was a finalist in the vocal competition "Olivia Gorra" in Mexico City the following month. In 2018, she performed in Città della Pieve, Italy, during the premiere of the opera Sacco e Vanzetti, singing the main roles of Luigia Vanzetti and Comrad Blackwell as a guest artist with the International Opera Theater of Philadelphia.

At 28, Ms. Aldaz has successfully portrayed operatic roles such as Angelina in *La Cenerentola* and Nicklausse in *Les contes d'Hoffmann*.

Don José/Wigs & Makeup: Daniel Perez



Daniel Perez, originally from Mexico, is a tenor currently residing in Provo, Utah. He is currently a student of Isaac Hurtado at Utah Valley University. Perez is no stranger to Lyrical Opera Theater's stage as he has performed in multiple productions including: Pinkerton in Madame Butterfly, Mario Cavaradossi in Tosca, and Rodolfo in La Bohéme. He was recently a young artist at the 2023 Mediterranean Opera Festival in Sicily singing the role of Alfredo in La Traviata and Normanno/Arturo in Lucia di Lammermoor. His other more recent roles are: Hoffmann in The Tales of Hoffmann, Algernon

Moncrieff in the North American premiere of *L'importanza di essere Onesto*, Alfred in *Die Fledermaus*, and Camille de Rossillon in *The Merry Widow*. He has also sung as a chorister in multiple productions.





MARC ABBOTT, baritone, studied under tenor Harry Dunstan of the American Center for Puccini Studies, singing Pictordu (Cendrillon, Viardot), Guglielmo Wulf (Le Villi), Michele (Il tabarro), Scarpia (Tosca), Herr Colas (Bastien und Bastienne), and scenes as Count Almaviva (Le nozze di Figaro). More recently, he has sung the Notary/Doctor (Gianni Schicchi), performed in the ensemble in Utah Festival Opera's Carmen, and Schaunard (La bohème) with Lyrical Opera Theater. He currently teaches voice at Utah State University and in his private studio in Cache Valley with his wife, Jacquelyn, who is performing Frasquita in this production.

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Escamillio: Christopher Stockslager



Chris is a Utah native who graduated with his BA in Classical Voice from Westminster College in 2015. In 2017, he earned his MM also in Classical Voice from The Manhattan School of Music under Metropolitan Opera legend James Morris. Upcoming roles include the Eisenstein in Die Fledermaus, also with Lyrical Opera Theater. Previous role highlights include Don Basilio in Il Barbiere di Siviglia, Schaunard in La Bohème, Lord Savage in Jekyll & Hyde, Peter in Company, and various operatic, musical theatre, and jazz scenes and concerts in Utah & New York City.

Micaëla: Chelsea Alexandra



Chelsea Alexandra is thrilled to be returning to the Lyrical Opera Theater as Micaëla! Chelsea debuted here as Mimì from Puccini's La Boheme, which she revisited the role a second time from her previous performance in Novafeltria Italy. Since then she has portrayed the leading role of Cendrillon as Massanet's fairytale icon at UVAA and as The Mother at the Grand Theater, in Amahl and the Night Visitors. A graduate of UofU, Chelsea performed the role of Lauretta in Gianni Schicchi at Kingsbury Hall,

and scenes from *Così fan Tutte* and *La Traviata*, as Fiordiligi and Violetta. Chelsea thanks Kirstin Chávez, whose guidance has been pivotal to her success.

Höglund recently completed a season at Utah Festival Opera and Musical Theatre where he performed in the ensembles of *Lohengrin*, *Aida*, and *Our Town*; as well as in *Oliver*! as Mr. Sowerberry,

gaining him praise for "[springing] the show forward with [his] physical comedy and lively singing."

That fascination grew with him as he participated in high-school, college, and community choirs.
